Dear Parents/Carers

With the examination period now upon us, we enclose the details of study leave arrangements for Year 11 students. All students now have individual timetables and details of the exam process. This is also available on the academy website. We have also sent out the Final Furlong document which gives all revision sessions available.

In the period up until Friday 27 May, students will continue to attend all lessons as normal. If a student has taken his/her final exam in a subject, he/she must still attend lessons. Such lesson time is a good opportunity to prepare and revise for forthcoming exams within a supervised environment. Students will be dismissed on Friday 27 May at around 11.45 following a short assembly. Should a student need to remain in school until the end of the day this can be arranged.

After half term

Those subjects with exams still to be taken or any coursework lessons still not complete will require attendance or may have extra revision sessions available.

To ensure we maintain a full record of who is on site at all times, we ask that students register with their normal class teacher when they are studying on site.

Once the examination period is over, all students are invited to attend two special events, as follows.

This will provide an opportunity to reminisce, spend time with friends and consider all that they have achieved. The Assembly will be held in the PA Area and will commence at 11.30am.

Friday 1 July - Leavers' Prom at Slepe Hall, St Ives: this event starts at 7.00 pm for 7.30 pm and finishes at 11.30 pm. Invite only.

Exam results are available at the Academy on Thursday 25 August from 10.00 am until midday.

Throughout the entire exam period students must continue to wear full school uniform.
